RECOVERY PLANS

Resilience & Optimism

65%

of businesses are **positive** about the future

68%

of businesses have plans to expand, with 25% reporting that they have not changed

81% of businesses believe **locality** is important

65%

of businesses said they had cash reserves that will last one month or more

Premises

70% of businesses have returned to business premises

75%

of Manufacturing businesses continued to operate from their current premises throughout.

25% of respondents will continue to have remote working post-COVID

DIGITAL

Almost 60% of businesses have been able to respond to the digital requirements of remote working

48%

of respondents felt their staff didn't have the required digital skills

41% felt their staff needed more **training** and developing in digital skills need for investment to reduce the digital skills gap

FINANCIAL

79%

of businesses have been affected **financially**, and as a result are continuing to review strategies, business models and products and services offered

95%

of businesses have accessed Government backed financial support during the pandemic

CONCERNS

40%

of businesses said they had cash reserves that will last **beyond four** months

76%

of businesses have experienced cancelled contracts as a result of the pandemic. That's an increase from previous results
